Purpose	This policy regulates how the Whitehouse Institute of Design, Australia (Whitehouse) colle and manages the personal information of students, staff and clients in accordance with th <u>Australian Privacy Principles.</u>			
Scope	This policy applies to all aspects of personal information for staff, students and stakeholders across all campuses inclusive of the collection, storage, use, disclosure and disposal of personal information.			
Policy Statement	Collection of Personal Information			
	Personal information will be collected as part of the admissions and enrolment process, or in the case of employees as part of the staff engagement process, in accordance with current legislation.			
	Storage of Personal Information			
	All personal information and data must be retained in secure locations, accessible only to staff with formal responsibility for that data area. Whitehouse will store data in secure systems and locations. The length of time data will be held will be informed by relevant sections of the legislation and other regulatory requirements.			
	Use of Personal Information			
	Whitehouse use of personal information will be strictly in accordance with current legislation.			
	Disclosure of Personal Information			
	Whitehouse will not disclose any person's personal information without their consent unless otherwise required to do so by law.			
	Organisations which Whitehouse may disclose information include:			
	<ul> <li>professional advisers including accounting auditors and lawyers</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>government and regulatory authorities including, but not limited to; Department of Immigration and Border Protection; Department of Education and Training; Department of Employment; Australian Skills Quality Authority; Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Authority and the Australian Taxation Office.</li> </ul>			
	Whitehouse may also be required to disclose personal information to comply with subpoenas, court orders and other legal processes.			
	In exceptional circumstances, personal information may be disclosed to a third party if it is necessary to do so in order to manage a threat to staff or students.			
	Access to Personal Information			
	Staff and students have the right to access their personal information, subject to some exceptions allowed by law. In addition, staff and students have the right to request the amendment of the personal information held if it is believed to be incorrect.			
	Accuracy of Information			
	Whitehouse takes all reasonable precautions to ensure that the personal information collected, used and disclosed is accurate, complete and up-to-date.
